



## October

The League purchased the following Items for the Community Rehabilitation Team:

**Aluminium Rollator with Seat:** a lightweight 4-wheeled walker to be used for assessments before patients are advised to buy their own. The 2 walkers in the department have broken brakes and are no longer fit for purpose.

A **Pneumatic Post Amputation Mobility Aid** for amputees to try before they are given prosthetic limbs.

3 **Dyson AM06 Desk Fans** for the Rehab team communal office.

10 Pairs **Palm Aid Transfer Gloves** which would enable 1 carer instead of 2 to help a patient to transfer. A pilot study has shown the advantages of these, which can also be used by family carers. A further trial of 10 Palm Aids would, if successful, lead to an NHS budget for future purchases.
